Problem:	At present, only facilities with more than 50 employees have received funding for Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) through the FAA National Voluntary Public Access Defibrillation (PAD) Program. There are ongoing discussions surrounding methods and funding for the remaining facilities to be included in this program, but these facilities are not yet nationally funded.			
Symptom:	The current AED program roll-out status may give facilities the impression that they cannot obtain AEDs.			
Solution:	Facilities with fewer than 50 employees are eligible to purchase new AED equipment with local funds if they coordinate with the National PAD Program Office and comply with program guidelines. Facilities must contact the PAD Program Office at the numbers listed in the POC Information section of this Advisory before taking any action.
