Problem:	Changing Peabody PM/Cert Master "Total Tasks" field may cause an unintended consequence in that the National Task Glossary Code (TGC) will no longer supply the Order number/paragraph reference. This contributes to incorrect logging and 6000.15 compliance issues.			
Symptom:	Lack of awareness of the effect that modifying the PM/Cert Master fields may have on logging requirements.			
Solution:	National task references may have a default "Total Tasks" of other than "1" and should not be modified unless the user has an understanding of the results. If no other fields below the task count are populated with data, the default value for this field is "1".			
Remarks:		There is currently an approved NAS Change Proposal (NCP) that will mitigate the issue via a Remote Monitor ing and Logging System (RMLS) software modification.
